CASS COUNTY ORDINANCE 93-02
"NO-WAKE" ORDINANCE
AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE OPERATION OF WATERCRAFT IN
COMMISSIONER DISTRICT II OF CASS COUNTY.

The Cass County Board of Commissioners do ordain:

SECTION I. Definitions:

The following words and phrases when used in this ordinance have the meanings as set forth below:

- A. "PERSON" means and includes an individual, partnership, corporation or any body of persons, whether incorporated or formed into an association or not.
- B. "OPERATE" means to navigate or otherwise use a watercraft.
- C. "WATERCRAFT" is as defined in M.S. 86B.005, Subd. 18.
- D. "SLOW-NO-WAKE" means the operation of a watercraft at the slowest possible speed necessary to maintain steerage and in no case greater than 5 m.p.h.

SECTION II. Regulations:

No person shall operate a watercraft at a greater than a slow-no-wake speed on the following:

- A. On the Gull Lake Chain of Lakes including Gull (11-305), Margaret (11- 222), Upper Gull (11-218), Ray (11-220), Spider (11-221), Roy (11-398), and Green Lake, also known as Greenhill Bay to Gull Lake (11-305), in the following channels:
 - 1. Between Gull and Upper Gull Lakes (north and south ends).
 - 2. Between Margaret and Upper Gull Lakes.
 - 3. The narrows of Upper Gull Lake (SW1/4 of Section 9, City of Lake Shore).
 - 4. Between Upper Gull and Ray Lakes.
 - 5. The channel between Ray Lake (also known as Bass) and Roy Lake.
 - 6. The area between Ray Lake (also known as Bass) and Spider Lake between Spider Lake and Roy Lake.
- B. On the Gull River, in the area of the Cass County Highway #36 Bridge.
- C. In the channel between the Upper and Lower portion of Sylvan Lake (11-304).
- D. On all of Green Lake, also known as Greenhill Bay to Gull Lake, and all of the channel between Green and Gull Lake.

SECTION III. Exemptions:

- A. Authorized resource management, emergency and law enforcement personnel when acting in the performance of their duties shall be exempt from the provisions of this ordinance.
- B. Temporary exemptions from this ordinance may be granted by the County Sheriff for races, regattas, etc.

SECTION IV. Emergencies:

In the situation of local emergency, the Cass County Board may enact special temporary controls for a period of not more than five days. The Commissioner of the Department of Natural Resources shall be notified as soon as practical during the five day period.

SECTION V. Marking:


The Cass County Sheriff shall be responsible for informing the public, posting notification at all public accesses and marking all areas affected by this ordinance as practical.

SECTION VI. Enforcement and Penalties:


The Cass County Sheriff shall be responsible for enforcement of this ordinance. Any person who shall violate any provisions of this ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor.

The Cass County Board of Commissioners, having received the written approval of the Commissioner of Natural Resources on February 22, 1984, pursuant to M.S. 378.32 and 6 MCAR 1.0223 B, originally passed and adopted this ordinance on the 20th day of March, 1984; revised on the 19th day of October, 1993; revisions approved by the Commissioner of Natural Resources on November 24, 1993 pursuant to 86B.205, Subd. 4.



CASS COUNTY ORDINANCE NUMBER 83-01

AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE OPERATION OF WATERCRAFT IN COMMISSIONERS DISTRICT # 2 OF CASS COUNTY

The Cass County Board of Commissioners do ordain:

SECTION I. Definitions:

The following words and phrases when used in this ordinance have the meanings as set forth below:

- A. "PERSON" means and includes an individual, partnership, corporation or any body of persons, whether incorporated or formed into an association or not.
- B. "OPERATE" means to navigate or otherwise use a watercraft.
- C. "WATERCRAFT" is as defined in M.S. 361.02, Subd. 7.
- D. "SLOW-NO-WAKE" means the operation of a watercraft at the slowest possible speed necessary to maintain steerage and in no case greater than 5 m.p.h.

SECTION II. Regulations:

No person shall operate a watercraft at a greater than a slow-no-wake speed on the following:

- A. On the Gull Lake Chain of Lakes (including Gull (11-305), Margaret (11-222), Upper Gull (11-218), Ray (11-220), Spider (11-221) and Roy (11-398) Lakes) in the following channels:
 - 1. Between Gull and Upper Gull Lakes (north and south ends).
 - 2. Between Margaret and Upper Gull Lakes.
 - 3. The narrows of Upper Gull Lake (SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 9, Lakeshore, City of).
 - 4. Between Upper Gull and Ray Lakes.
 - 5. The channel between Ray Lake (also known as Bass) and Roy Lake.
 - 6. That area between Ray Lake (also known as Bass) and Spider Lake between Spider Lake and Roy Lake.
- B. On the Gull River, in the area of the Cass County Highway 36 Bridge.
- C. In the channel between the Upper and Lower portion of Sylvan Lake (11-304).

SECTION III. Exemptions:

- A. Authorized resource management, emergency and law enforcement personnel when acting in the performance of their duties shall be exempt from the provisions of this ordinance.

B. Temporary exemptions from this ordinance may be granted by the County Sheriff for races, regattas, etc.

SECTION IV. Emergencies:

In the situation of local emergency, the Cass County Board may enact special temporary controls for a period of not more than five days. The Commissioner of the Department of Natural Resources shall be notified as soon as practicable during the five day period.

SECTION V. Marking:
